


## Hawkesbury High School

If a teacher contacts you, please take this opportunity to ask questions or identify any concerns. Online learning is new to all of us, so any feedback is greatly appreciated. If your child does not have a Google Classroom code, please ask them to check their @education.nsw.gov.au emails, or you can contact the school for the relevant codes.

I would once again like to reiterate my appreciation of everything you are doing as a parent at this challenging time. I would also like to emphasise that, as a parent, you are in the best position to decide what is best for your child, including balancing family pressures and your child's wellbeing with the demands of online learning.
